In lieu of flowers, the family asks that donations be made to Gospel Light Baptist Church at 39315 Romans Way, Mechanicsville, MD 20659.



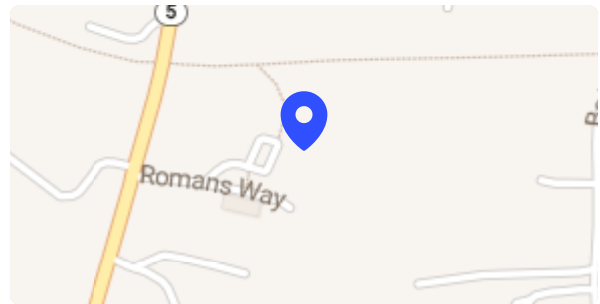

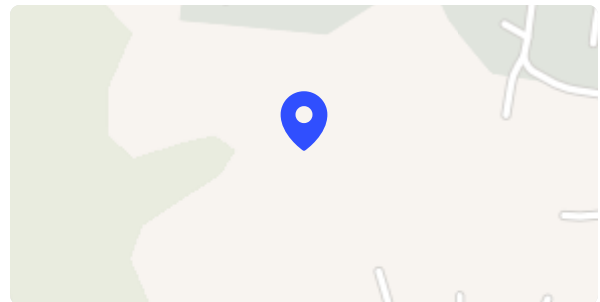

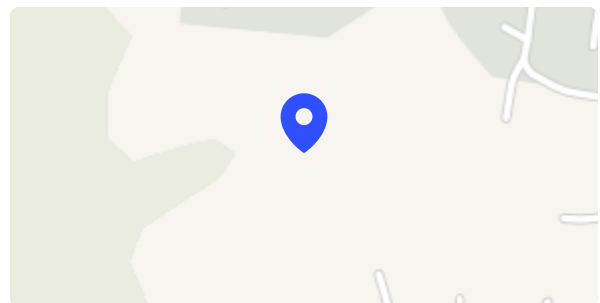
