Patricia June Banton Ivie was born in Richmond, Virginia on October 14, 1926, daughter of Earl Winfree Banton, Sr. and Mattie Alice Hall Banton. The Lord called Pat home on Saturday, September 28, 2019.

At the age of 14, her family moved to Washington, DC where Pat became active in Capital Hill Metropolitan Baptist Church. It was there she met Arnold W. Ivie whom she married on June 14, 1947. God blessed the Ivies with two daughters, Gail Ivie Clark (Lincoln Clark) of Waldorf and Janice (Jan) Ivie of La Plata. Arnold went to be with the Lord on June 8, 1981.

For nine years, Pat worked as a secretary at the Federal Reserve Board in Washington, DC. She resigned to become a full-time mom. In 1969, she became the first secretary of the Potomac Baptist Association where she served for 25 years.

A member of the First Baptist Church of Waldorf since January 1963, Pat served at various times as pianist, organist, Sunday School Teacher, and on a number of committees. She also helped with music in the kindergarten in the 1960's and was a pianist for the Children's Worship Program for a number of years.
